PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome back to Term 3.

You may have noticed there have been a number of upgrades made to various areas around the school during the holidays. The courtyard, adjoining the HSIE and Mathematics Faculties, has been renovated and is nearing completion. This area will become a focal point of the school and was used yesterday to host a barbeque for the guests of our NAIDOC assembly. I would like to thank the staff and students who have given so much of their time to work on this project.

The school will commence its environmental program to move all of its lighting over to LED next week. This will have considerable environmental benefit and it is estimated save the school approximately \$40,000 annually on utilities costs. This money can then be spent on supporting student learning in the classroom.

Year 12 are preparing steadily for their HSC and many teachers have given up their time over the holidays, weekends and after school to provide extra tuition. The school is also undergoing a trial of Edrolo, which many students have reported has been incredibly valuable in providing additional support in revision. Year 12 are generally working very hard and we encourage them to maintain this high standard until the end of the year.

Year 10 are about to undertake HSC Minimum Standards testing which is an important credential for receiving their HSC in 2021. We encourage every student, irrespective of their intentions for next year, to undertake these exams to the best of their ability. Experience has taught me that the plans made as a 15 or 16-year-old change over time and this credential will be invaluable in later life.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Life Ready is a compulsory program for all senior students in NSW.

We offer 2 choices for Year 11 students.....

- 1. A camp at Broken Bay Sport and Rec (the preferred option)
- 2. An alternative program delivered at school, but it won't be nearly as much fun!!!!!!!!

Those students attending the Life Ready camp at Broken Bay in Term 4 should have by now done the following.

- Brought their school permission note in to Ms Barber or Mr Krix.
- Paid at least a \$50 deposit for the camp.

There are still spots available for those students who have not yet brought in their notes.

We encourage all Year 11 to take part in this camp, because it will likely be the last opportunity to take part in such an activity before students complete their HSC.

Details for the camp are as follows:

- The camp is 2 nights and 3 days, starting on the SECOND SCHOOL DAY of Term 4, Tuesday, October 15th and finishing Thursday, October 17.
- Buses take students to Patonga to catch the camp ferry.
- Buses depart at approximately 8:40 am from the school bus bay.
- Students need to pack light (no huge suitcases, please) as there are no luggage compartments on the buses. Bags will be placed on floor.

• Please remember that all students not attending the camp are expected to attend school for the duration of the program. SPORT

The past few weeks have been very busy in sport, with Kincumber High being represented at school, zone and regional levels. Firstly, we would like to thank all staff who have taken time out of their busy schedules to coach and train our teams, to give us as many opportunities to compete in the things we enjoy.

In recent weeks, we've had an influx of rugby tournaments. Our U14's and U16's boys sides participated in the Waratah Cup in Week 6 of Term 2. Our dancers were outstanding to watch perform each night – we have a very talented group of dancers at KHS and it really is great to work with them and see them dance on stage.




CC Schools Showcase

Visual Arts, Visual Design and Photography

What a start to Term 3!!! Visual Arts students from Years 9 to 11 made the journey to the Art Gallery of NSW, to see the art that changed history. Students explored the fascinating life and pioneering work of Marcel Duchamp, who made us re-think our ideas about art. Spanning the artist's six decade career, the exhibition features iconic works, such as Nude Descending the Staircase (No.2) 1912 and Fountain 1950 (a replica of the original 1917). The students learnt about how Duchamp established his reputation as a major disruptor of the art world, his intellect and inventions. Students were interested and engaged throughout their gallery visit and once again, were excellent representatives for Kincumber High School.



Artist in Residence -KHS Interested and Talented Program

Our Artist in Residence, Juz Kitson, is an Australian artist who works out of the historic town Jingdezhen, the 'porcelain capital' of China, and her own beautiful studio on the south coast of NSW. Engaging with ceramics, textiles and drawing, her work embodies the relationship between the ephemerality of humankind and the varied mix of flora and fauna in our environment.



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Juz inspired our students to look at their environment to draw inspiration for a mini body of work they created over a two day period. Juz delivered an artist talk, where she talked about her school days, her years studying at the National Art School and 'Jan Murphy' as the Gallery who sells her work.

Staff and our HSC Visual Arts students worked alongside Juz as well, to obtain knowledge of her artmaking techniques. Some highly specialised teaching for Year 12 and extra Teacher Professional Learning for us.
