YEAR 10 COMMERCE - CANBERRA EXCURSION

From the 14th August to the 16th August, a group of Commerce students attended an excursion to Canberra. Leaving bright and early on Monday morning with their Ugg boots and Oodies, they made their way to the nation's capital.

The Museum of Australian Democracy at Old Parliament House had students re-enacting the famous dismissal of Gough Whitlam within the very rooms that the sessions of parliament and private meetings took place. The next tour at the Royal Australian Mint allowed students to explore the various stages of economic development in the country, including viewing original coins that were used in the 18th Century.

For Tuesday, students engaged with the National Electoral Education Centre to explore the nature of the preferential voting system, explored artwork at Reconciliation Place, and then headed into the High Court of Australia for a tour. Students finished the day at the Australian War Memorial where the emotional experiences of loss and sacrifice of our soldiers were felt by all.

Our final day in Canberra included a surprise tour by Colin, the beloved bus driver, of the embassies around town. Students finished with a tour of Parliament House where they completed a mock sitting in parliament and then viewed both the House of Representatives and the Senate.

The level of engagement of every single student was outstanding and the school was incredibly proud of the politeness and enthusiasm that was exhibited throughout the excursion.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government contributed funding of \$30 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program. The rebate has been paid directly to the school after students successfully took part in many of the learning opportunities in Canberra.



Mathematics

We have welcomed Mr Bernard Pols as a temporary placement on the Maths staff this term, and he has been busy helping out with after school maths and working hard with his classes. A reminder that we offer free help after school every Wednesday between 2:30 and 3:15. If you have something specific you would like help with, drop into maths and let one of the teachers know so they can organise resources to assist you.

Due to a rise in supplier costs, we now need to charge \$33 for calculators bought through the school. As officeworks is currently charging \$44 for the same model, this is still a fairly good deal...pay at the office and bring your receipt to the maths staffroom.

Currently year 9 students are being issued with their next assessment task; this one is an assignment to be done at home, and student are reminded not to leave it until the last minute!

Year 11 have been working hard on the lead up to their final examinations for the Year 11 course before moving into Year 12 next term. A reminder that for a number of students, Standard 1 is a good option if you are finding your current course difficult, even if you are looking at an ATAR. Talk to Mrs Woodley or Mrs Barber if you are uncertain about your options. Extension 2 lessons will also start next term; Mr Kelly can't wait to get started the new cohort.




This term Enrichment maths (Year 9 and 10 elective) have been doing some hands-on activities. Year 9 completed a unit on construction, with a focus on origami and following scaffolds. Their work was displayed on a poster as their assessment task, with some excellent examples completed.

The most difficult design we managed was the lotus show below, which took two periods (and a number of false starts!) to get right.





Year 10 worked on the Soma cube puzzle, Mr Nicol kindly assisted by printing a copy of the 3D puzzle for each student using the 3D printer.



Both classes have also been working on some use of technology this term, with year 9 working on Hour of Code and Tinkercad, and year 10 using a program called Shelly to learn some intricate coding.










The Annual PDHPE Snow Trip
