I would like to welcome these very capable staff and extend my gratitude to all staff members for their ongoing dedication and commitment to ensuring that our students receive the best possible education.

I am proud to report that our students' HSC performance in 2022 was exceptional. Our students achieved outstanding results across a range of subjects, and I would like to commend them on their hard work and dedication. In 2022, the students achieved 36 Band 6 results which were attained by 17 teachers across 7 faculties. There were also 121 Band 5 results across all subjects. These results are amongst the best in the school's long and storied history and place it as the highest performing comprehensive high school on the Central Coast. In terms of all schools on the Central Coast it ranked much higher than most of the Catholic and Independent schools in the area. Our school community should be justifiably proud of the efforts of our students, teachers, and families in supporting our students to achieve such impressive results.

At Kincumber High School, we are committed to upholding high standards in our community. We aim to foster a culture of mutual respect and responsibility, where all members of our community feel valued and supported. Our community is characterised by a strong sense of inclusivity and diversity, and I am proud to lead a school that values these qualities. Our high standards also extend to our uniform policy. We are committed to maintaining a high standard of dress and appearance, which fosters a sense of pride and belonging within our school community. I encourage all students to take pride in their uniform and wear it with distinction. Finally, I am pleased to report that there have been significant infrastructure developments at Kincumber High School. There are currently millions of dollars being spent on infrastructure upgrades which are all due for completion by the end of the year. These include the library renovation due to commence in Term 2. During this renovation, the Staff Common Room will serve as a temporary library to support students learning. The major wireless upgrade throughout the entire school has begun which will significantly improve the network at the school and even allow major exams, such as NAPLAN to occur online in the School Hall. The covered walkways - on ramps to and from the Hastie, and the new handrails throughout the Quad continue to be installed. The car park upgrade to allow Support Unit students safe access to Assisted Travel has been largely completed and the new kitchen in the Prep Room is awaiting only the industrial dishwasher to be installed. We continue to invest in state-of-the-art facilities and these developments reflect our commitment to providing our students with the best possible learning environment.

In conclusion, I would like to thank our school community for their ongoing support and commitment to Kincumber High School. I look forward to continuing to work together to ensure that our school remains a vibrant and inclusive learning environment where all students can achieve their full potential.

We are excited to announce our school will be transitioning to an upgraded School Bytes finance system on 7 March 2023!

In preparation for the transition to a simplified finance system for both you and the school, we will be required to implement a short payment lockout period where we will not be able to receive any online or EFTPOS payments.

What this means for you

No payments can be made online or via EFTPOS from 4pm, Wednesday 1* March 2023.

- We will advise you when payments can resume closer to the above date
- Any existing payment links that have been sent to you previously in emails can still be used after the transition and will automatically redirect to the new system
- After the transition, a School Bytes portal will be available for you to register and begin using (https://portal schoolbytes education)
- All previous payments made will be migrated to the new School Bytes finance system and portal
- What is the School Bytes portal

The School Bytes portal provides flexibility for you to conveniently:

- Make school payments online (including paying for multiple siblings at once)
- Use a family credit to pay for an activity or school contributions
- Download a receipt for payments made
- View all historical payments in one place
- Complete and submit digital permission notes
- View the status of all permission notes
- Request a refund if required

This can be done where vou want at any time: day or night.

Through the portal, you will easily be able to download a receipt once a payment has been made and have access to view all historical payments when needed. Online payments are processed in real-time and can be viewed by school staff immediately.

While our preference is for payments to be made via the portal, we will still accept payment via cash, cheque, money order and EFTPOS.

The English Faculty has had a brilliant start to 2023, with all years settling into their new class and learning activities!

Year 7 have begun the year with a focus on visual literacy and are preparing for their first Assessment - a short answer comprehension test. We are using the picture book 'Cicada', by Australian author Shaun Tan as our core text.

MATHEMATICS

The Year 11 Maths In Trade Pathway class has started the year looking at the mathematics involved within the plumbing industry. We have focused on PVC pipes and have learnt:

- about the different types of PVC pipes
- about the different fittings used to connect PVC pipes
- how to interpret the information written on the side of PVC pipes
- the standard sizes of PVC pipes used
- conversions between the imperial and metric system
- tools used for measurement within the plumbing industry and how to accurately read them
- limits of accuracy when reading measuring instruments

The students then used this knowledge to write a formal quote for the supply and installation of PVC piping to connect guttering to two rainwater tanks. This was really well done and their product knowledge proved extremely useful when selecting and pricing the products for the job.

It was great to see so many students roll up for After School Maths this week - we run it from 2:30-3:15 every Wednesday in F23, and using nearby rooms if required. No sign in is required and it's free, just come along, bring your maths homework or classwork you may need some help with. Ask us for some extra work if you want to practise something. See Mr Kelly or Mrs Woodley for more details. And we have free ice blocks!

A reminder that ALL students need a calculator for Maths, every lesson. A separate book just for Maths is also required, not a 'five in one' style book please.





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MATHEMATICS

Year 9 Elective students have started the year with a topic on 'Fractals'; a relatively new branch of Mathematics. It is important in Chaos Theory, creating algorithms, programming and in medicine. Students have experienced with creating fractals using online generators, and their first assessment task involves hand drawing a Sierpinski Gasket Fractal to five iterations (stages). UPCOMING ASSESSMENT IN HSIE

The first assessment tasks for our HSIE courses will be upon us before we know it. It is important to plan ahead, mark the due dates into your calendar and ensure that task preparations start early. The school's assessment policies are available on the KHS website as is our Misadventure Form which is needed to apply for any revision to task due dates, extensions, and to inform us about circumstances affecting task performance. Evidence is required but it is important to be aware of these processes, and it is always best to communicate with the relevant teacher about any concerns regarding assessment tasks. SCIENCE REPORT

The Science Faculty has been thrilled to see our students leap into learning this term and display their understanding through a variety of hands on experiences.

Our Year 7 cohort has been incredibly excited to enter the laboratory where they have developed their understanding of lab safety and achieved their Bunsen Burner Licenses. The Year 8 students have taken part in a range of activities looking at energy transformations and energy changes. Meanwhile, our super scientists in Year 10 have been engaging in discussions around DNA, reproductive technologies such as IVF and the associated ethical issues.

The Stage 6 students have had the opportunity to work like a true scientist. Our Year 12 Biology group undertook a trip to Macquarie University to utilise Gel Electrophoresis and Polymerase Chain Reaction technologies to investigate the species captured in NSW Shark Nets and evaluate the success of this program. Meanwhile our Year 11 Biology cohort were beach bound as part of a Depth Study on Ecosystems.

Our faculty was also excited to see one of its teachers celebrated. Mrs Lara Pratt was recognised by the Professional Teachers' Council of NSW for her significant and continuous contributions to the subject of Marine Studies and the Marine Teachers' Association of NSW. The award was presented by the MTA President and Minister for Education Ms Sarah Mitchell.
