We also have had several new Year 8 students join our school this term. For our students, please continue to make them feel welcome as they settle into the KHS community.




Year 10 Update:



SCIENCE REPORT

We have been excited to start a brand new school year and see our students' skills develop. Our super scientists in Year 7 had their interest ignited as they gained their Bunsen Burner licences. Meanwhile the bright sparks in Year 8 utilised electrical circuits to distinguish between conductors and insulators. The Chemists in Year 12 showed they have a really "basic" understanding of acids as part of an investigation into neutralisation reactions.

The gene-iuses in Year 12 Biology students had an incredible opportunity to immerse themselves in a real laboratory setting at Macquarie University as part of their depth study focusing on the use of genetics in conservation management. Students extracted DNA from shark tissue that had been obtained as part of the 'NSW Shark Meshing (Bather Protection) Program' to identify the species of sharks that are being caught in these nets. Genetic technologies such as PCR and gel electrophoresis were used to to analyse the DNA.



Classes have begun the year positively with Year 7 Geography starting work on 'Landscapes and Landforms', Year 8 looking at 'Medieval History', Year 9 investigating 'Making a Nation" and Year 10 Geography have commenced their studies into 'Environmental Change and Management'.

The HSIE faculty look forward to another successful year of learning at Kincumber High School. Most students have commenced in a productive and well-organised fashion. Just a reminder from us about the recommended equipment for all HSIE lessons (see below).



For those new to KHS it is worth going over the structure of our junior History and Geography courses, like many schools we adopt a semesterised system for studies in HSIE years 7-10. Each year group spend one semester (two terms) studying History and Geography, switching at the mid-point in the year. This pattern alternates for each stage to enable the allocation of textbooks and other resources. In each semester of study students can expect two assessment tasks, each worth 50% of their grade. Students will maintain the same teacher for both History and Geography across the 2025 school year. MATHEMATICS REPORT


There have been a couple of changes to the Mathematics staff for 2025. We welcome Ms Farmer and Ms Dell (who are job-sharing) and Mr Englert.

We will be running After School Maths again on Wednesday afternoons from 2:30-3:15 in F23. All students are welcome. Remember to bring your homework or work you wish to focus on. Laptops are available, and if you let me (Mrs Woodley) know in advance I can also organise any extra work required.

We are focusing on students completing a small amount of homework each week this year. Most classes have a homework book, and are expected to complete weekly sets of work to consolidate their learning. All Year 8 students are also expected to be accessing the NAPLAN questions on the website Mr Kelly has built here: <u>https://sites.google.com/education.nsw.gov.au/year-8-mathematics/</u> starting with the Percentage quizzes. We are keen to see this cohort do the best they can in NAPLAN, especially as it is major focus in the school plan.



Welcome back and a special welcome to our new students joining us this year. We are looking forward to another great year in the KHS Support Unit.



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
ABORIGINAL EDUCATION
